Thank you for agreeing to be an advocate for the Equity Index. We have put together a toolkit to assist you with promoting the Women in Transport Equity Index 2023.

The Challenge - Why do we need to act now?

Transport, a vital industry employing over 1.5 million people and contributing £214 billion to the UK economy in 2020, faces a pressing challenge of attracting, recruiting and retaining diverse talent. With only 26% of the workforce being females, the sector is heavily male-dominated. In the sub-sectors, only 16% of the rail workforce is female and a mere 6% in aviation. In the bicycle sector, only 8% of cycle mechanics are women. The exact representation of women in maritime and road transport remains unknown, further underscoring the need for comprehensive data to address the gender imbalance across the industry.

The Women in Transport Equity Index 2023 is a collaborative project that seeks to provide essential baseline data, measure progress and recognise best practices in achieving gender diversity within the transport industry. By participating in the survey, individuals can contribute to shaping a more equitable future and driving positive change.

Key Points

Baseline Data: The Women in Transport Equity Index aims to gather comprehensive data on gender diversity within the transport sector, shedding light on the representation of women in transport-related positions and identifying areas for improvement. Each sub sector will have its on Index alongside the composite one for easy benchmarking — Air, Automotive, Bus & Coach, Bicycle, Logistics (including Warehousing), Maritime (including Ports), Road, Rail plus we will have ones for Infrastructure, Consultancies, and Recruitment (including head hunters).

Progress Measurement: The index will provide a unique cross-sectoral performance measurement, allowing companies to benchmark themselves against peers and track progress over time. This valuable information will drive continuous improvement and facilitate a more inclusive and equitable industry.

Recognition and Rewards: Companies that demonstrate exemplary practices will be acknowledged in the index report, with top-performing organisations receiving certificates of success recognition and marketing badges. By participating, companies can position themselves as leaders in diversity and inclusion.

Valuable Insights: Participants who complete the survey will receive individual scores. Once they have completed the index questions and submitted their answers, they have the opportunity to unlock access to WORK 180's full DEI assessment survey (normally valued at £2,500) . These insights will help organisations to further identify areas of strength and areas that require further attention.


