# 39th YAPI – TURKEYBUILD ISTANBUL: "Guest Region Africa Project"

39<sup>th</sup> YAPI – TURKEYBUILD ISTANBUL, which is the biggest and most extensive building material and technologies exhibition of the region and will be organized between May 10-14 2016, this year specifically hosts Africa with Kenya, Mozambique and Nigeria as part of the Guest Region Project.

Kenya, Mozambique and Nigeria which are targeted by the Turkish building sector and whose fast-growing consistent economies draw attention with their growth and construction expenses achieved in the construction sector, constitute a great potential for the Turkish building sector. While possible cooperation, investments and the opportunities that the region presents for trading relations are evaluated with the activities that will be organized as part of the "Guest Region Project", the goal is also to support the international activity of the Turkish building sector.

The Guest Region Africa Project, organized as part of the 39<sup>th</sup> Yapı – Turkeybuild Istanbul, hosts Kenya, Mozambique and Nigeria in 2016. As part of the project; the senior officials of the subject from Turkey and the related countries will be gathered with the events that will be organized before and during the exhibition.

YEM Exhibitions, who has been successful at being a productive trading platform for the building sector with its specialized fairs for 39 years, will bring the business and cooperation opportunities in the construction sector related to the countries at Yapı – Turkeybuild Istanbul. When Turkey's construction material and contracting services exportation shares in these countries are increased, huge growth opportunities are to be expected for both sectors according to a research by YEM Exhibitions. The data that shows the general economic overviews, construction sector size of the countries and their foreign trade relations on a sectoral basis with Turkey that will be hosted at the exhibition are as follows:

#### **KENYA**

In Kenya, which has a national income of 64 million dollars, there have recently been important infrastructure projects in the construction sector and the housing constructions have begun to increase following the demand for housing. In line with their intention of achieving the Vision 2030 goals, the construction of summer housing areas, free trade ports, specialized industrial zones, wholesale – retail sale centers, exhibition grounds, their road and energy connections are on the table. The other projects are the treatment of airports, building a new port in Lamu, extending the Kenya – Uganda petroleum pipeline and building of wind/solar energy facilities, oil distribution, storage and processing facilities. In Kenya, the construction expenditures were 4.8 billion dollars, construction material market was at 3.4 billion dollars and the construction material importation was at 1.1 billion dollars in 2014.

#### **NIGERIA**

Nigeria's GDP size is 580 billion dollars. As a country that produces oil, Nigeria's physical infrastructure is at a highly limited level by general view. Since transportation, energy and communication services are insufficient, high amounts of investment is needed. In recent years, there is an increase on the share allocated for road and construction projects in the budget. An important amount of resources are taken from the budget in order to complete the unfinished roads, treat the roads in bad condition and build new roads. In Nigeria, the construction expenditures were 27.3 billion dollars, construction material market was at 19.1 billion dollars and the construction material importation was at 3.5 billion dollars in 2014.





#### **MOZAMBIQUE**

According to the estimated data of 2015, Mozambique has a national income of 17.5 billion dollars. Mozambique entered an economic growth process that depends on discoveries towards the maritime petroleum reserves and mining-metal ore resources and investments for their extraction and energy-goods exportation. In the following years, there will be investments for infrastructure and energy-mining that will drive the construction investments and expenditures again in Mozambique. Important investments are targeted in the 2015 – 2019 development plan of the government. Docks, new railway lines, new highways, renewal of the current highways and construction of hydroelectric power plants are planned. As of 2015, it is predicted that a construction expenditure of 1.12 billion dollars was made in Mozambique. Correspondingly, there is a construction material market that is at a size of approximately 780 million dollars. Mozambique fulfills an important part of its construction material requirement by importation.
